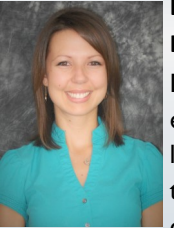
Dr. Jennifer Sansone, PsyD

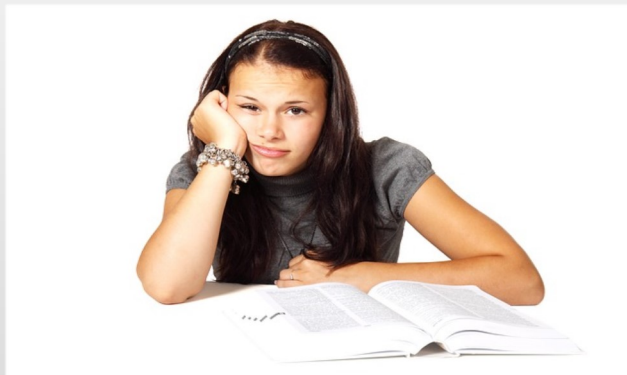
